Anthem notes: *This Is the Day* is an anthem composed by Harold Silvester and published in 2016. Silvester is a retired visual arts teacher who lives in Madison, Wisconsin and now focuses on composing and art. The first section of the text is adapted from an original text by well-known British hymn-writer Isaac Watts (1674-1748). The second section of the text is what we know as the *Doxology* text which was written by Thomas Ken (1637-1711) and also adapted by Silvester. *Most glorious Lord of life* is an anthem written by John Rutter as a result of a commission for the Harvard University Choir at Harvard Memorial Church in Cambridge, Massachusetts. John Rutter (b. 1945) is well-known as an English composer, conductor, editor, arranger and record producer, primarily of choral music. The first half of the text is taken from a poem by Edmund Spenser (1552-1599) who is known as one of the greatest poets in the English language. During Spenser's time, Lent was a time of self-punishment, and Easter was a time of illumination, redemption and celebration of all of the good in life. The text focuses on God's love and asks for happiness for all of mankind. The anthem ends with St. John of Damascus' text "The Day of Resurrection."

Hallelujah is the final movement of the second part of the *Messiah*. Apparently at the London premiere in 1743, King George II stood during "Hallelujah!" which made everyone else stand. Portions of the text come from Revelation 19:6 (for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth), Revelation 19:16 (King of Kings and Lords of Lords) and Revelation 11:15 (And he shall reign for ever and ever).



Join us next Sunday for *Holy Humor and Joy in the Lord Sunday*.

This Sunday was part of an ancient church tradition that celebrated the days after Easter with laughter and joy in their worship and fellowship life. Our entire service will be filled with light-hearted liturgy — the message brought in various forms and involving all ages. All our music and prayers will help us to truly lift our hearts together toward the God who raised Jesus from the dead and let joy reign again on the earth and in our lives. PASTORAL TRANSITION UPDATES

PASTOR/HEAD-OF-STAFF SEARCH - FORMATION OF PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE (PNC) – CONGREGATIONAL MEETING CALLED FOR MAY 21st.

The Session has approved a vision and focus for the next Pastor/Head of Staff after several months of good discussion, including feedback from many members. That vision/focus will go to the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry so we can elect our PNC and get started with the search by summer.

The Church Nominating Committee is accepting Nomination Forms for members to serve on the PNC. This PNC will consist of nine people who are members of the Church and, altogether, represent the whole Church as best as possible. **The nomination forms are in the Church Office – please place filled-out forms in the Collection Box, also located in the Church Office.** Nominations, including self-nominations, **will be collected April 16th-May 1st.** At that point the Church Nominating Committee will work to contact nominees to present a representative slate of nine members to be elected at a **called Congregational Meeting on May 21st after the 11:00am Joint Worship service.**
